Sixty-four years of Jerrold L. Lockshin's life have been actively dedicated to Scouting. His adult career began in 1957 when he served as activities chairman for the McKinley District of the Buckeye Council. Since then, Mr. Lockshin has been involved from the local to national levels with stints as council president, district executive board member, regional vice president, and chairman of the National Jewish Committee on Scouting. Currently, he is a member of the National Religious Relationships Committee, regional vice president, and regional chairman for the Jewish Committee on Scouting. For his steadfast commitment, Mr. Lockshin has been honored with the Silver Beaver, Silver Antelope, and Shofar awards. He is a Vigil Honor member of the Order of the Arrow.

Reaching out to his community and the world at large, Mr. Lockshin is a past state, national, and international president of the United States Junior Chamber of Commerce (Jaycees). He has served as president of Shaaray Torah Synagogue of Canton, the Canton Jewish Community Federation, Canton Urban League, and Stark County and State of Ohio Mental Health Federation, and as a member of the National United Jewish Appeal Young Leadership Cabinet. Mr. Lockshin has been recognized with the Canton Jaycee of the Year Award, Revella Kopstein Man of the Year Award, the 1990 Israel Freedom Award, and the David Ben Gurion Award from the State of Israel.
